The Georgia BIO and the University of Georgia's Selig Center for Economic Growth are collaborating on the third annual Georgia Life Sciences Industry Report, titled *Shaping Infinity*.

The report will be based on a comprehensive survey mailed in early April to over 300 pharmaceutical, biotechnology, diagnostics and device manufacturing firms, as well as to agricultural, bioenergy and biofuels firms in Georgia. Your company will be included in the survey. This year's survey also includes life sciences industry workforce questions submitted by the UGA's Fanning Institute.



It will also yield valuable insights into the directions and conditions of growth. In addition to the data, the report will include expert analysis from the Selig Center. This year's report, supported by a grant from the Georgia Department of Economic Development, will be presented at the Georgia Life Sciences Summit on September 24, 2008.


